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Dear Reader:
Long ago powerful interests seeking to merge the United States into what Henry Kissinger and the elitists of the Council on Foreign Relations call the New World Order recognized that to accomplish their goal they must so change the structure of the American government and economy as to make them compatible with those of the Soviet Union and the bankrupt Socialist states of Western Europe. Only then would the Great Merger to ensure their own permanent domination of the world be possible. To do this it would be necessary greatly to increase the size and authority of our federal government, and then to use that authority by stages to manipulate, sabotage, and loot the once-free and efficient American economy to make it conformable with those of the Marxist world.

Field headquarters for this Conspiracy in the United States are centered in the opulent offices of the Council on Foreign Relations at the Harold Pratt House across the street from the Soviet Embassy in New York City. It is there that Henry Kissinger was trained as C.F.R. Director of Studies and employed as a member of the editorial board of *Foreign Affairs*, the C.F.R. strategy journal which communicates policy to cooperating members of the "Liberal" Establishment.

In this issue of *American Opinion* Alan Stang reports the current strategy directives of this conspiracy as laid out in *Foreign Affairs*. That strategy involves the C.F.R.'s "no growth" campaign aimed at smothering our economy by creating shortages in energy fuels — a conspiracy on which William P. Hoar provides further hard evidence in his analysis of "Our Energy." A second current strategy of the Council on Foreign Relations which Mr. Stang identifies is the plan to loot and control America's vast food supplies. As with fuel, the objective is at once to make possible the manipulation of our own population and to assure control over inefficient or destitute foreign powers. Dr. Susan L.M. Huck presents further details of this conspiracy, which threatens actual mass starvation, in her report on "Our Food" which begins on page nine.

Development of the political control necessary to insure success in these operations is meanwhile proceeding. Chief executive officer of the Council on Foreign Relations is David Rockefeller, whose brother was recently manipulated into the Vice Presidency. In the article beginning on the next page, Gary Allen tells how the Rockefellers have created the largest political lobby in our nation's history — with an annual budget in excess of six million dollars — to assure that all goes according to plan.

What can we do? We can look upon this issue of *American Opinion* as on the score of a battle anthem. We can remove the mute and sound the horn of warning. We can breathe the music of vigilance. We can blow the bugle that awakens the American garrison.

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COMMON CAUSE

Rockefeller Lobby For The New Collectivism

■ FOR DECADES the Rockefeller family has been promoting collectivism through tax-free foundations which have dumped cash into almost every Socialist scheme known to man. Now they are enlisting a proletarian army to demand power for the people through legislation which ultimately means power for the Rockefellers. That organization is called Common Cause, and it has been expensively packaged and merchandised as a "people's lobby." There is, however, nothing common about the people behind Common Cause. If money turns your blood blue, theirs is the color of the waters of the mid-Pacific. And their motive in funding Common Cause is to cover their grab for ever more power with the carefully orchestrated cheers of their very own populist movement.

Common Cause was raised out of an earlier (1968) organization known as the "Urban Coalition," described by the *New York Times* as a group of "business, labor, religious, local government and civil rights leaders who propose to mobi-

lize committees in every city in the country for a massive campaign on urban poverty." The intent was to provide a broader base from which to exert "pressure from below" for the War on Poverty program begun under Lyndon Johnson. As with other radical and "Liberal" movements sponsored by the Establishment, the call was for ever greater federal spending, controls, and centralization. Chairman of the board of the Urban Coalition was that great commoner Andrew Heiskell, who serves as chairman of the board of Time, Incorporated, and whose wife is Marion Sulzberger Dryfoos of the *New York Times* Sulzbergers and Dryfooses. Financing for the operation was initially provided by a \$1.4 million grant from the proletarians at the Ford Foundation, notorious for its grants to radical organizations. Two additional grants totaling \$180,000 were made during 1968 to the New York and Newark chapters. The next year the Ford Foundation presented an additional \$2,950,000, and later that same year supplied a grant of \$540,000 more, "principally for training staff members of the Urban Coalition and its local counterparts."

Other archangels of the Urban Coalition included David Rockefeller, Martha Rockefeller, Chase Manhattan Bank, and Agnes Meyer of *Newsweek* and the *Washington Post*. Can you picture the nation's richest foundation, most powerful bank, richest family, two most influential newspapers, and its most widely read newsweeklies combining financial resources to battle the "special interests" in the name of the poor? Barnum rides again. The lambs, we are supposed to believe, were
