Shown are 12 of the known 15 specimens of the rare Remington Rider bronze barrel and frame single-shot, single-action, 17 cal. pistols patented Sept. 13, 1859 and manufactured 1860-63. It is estimated less than 1,000 were made. Only a percussion pellet. It is believed that the specimen shown in the center of the picture is possibly the pattern gun. These pistols were assembled for study by James R. Somers, Dallas, Tex. Transparency by Harry C. Knobe, Dallas, Tex., made with Hasselblad 2 1/4 x 2 1/4 Reflex Camera, f 2.8 Zeiss, 80 mm.
