## THE COVER

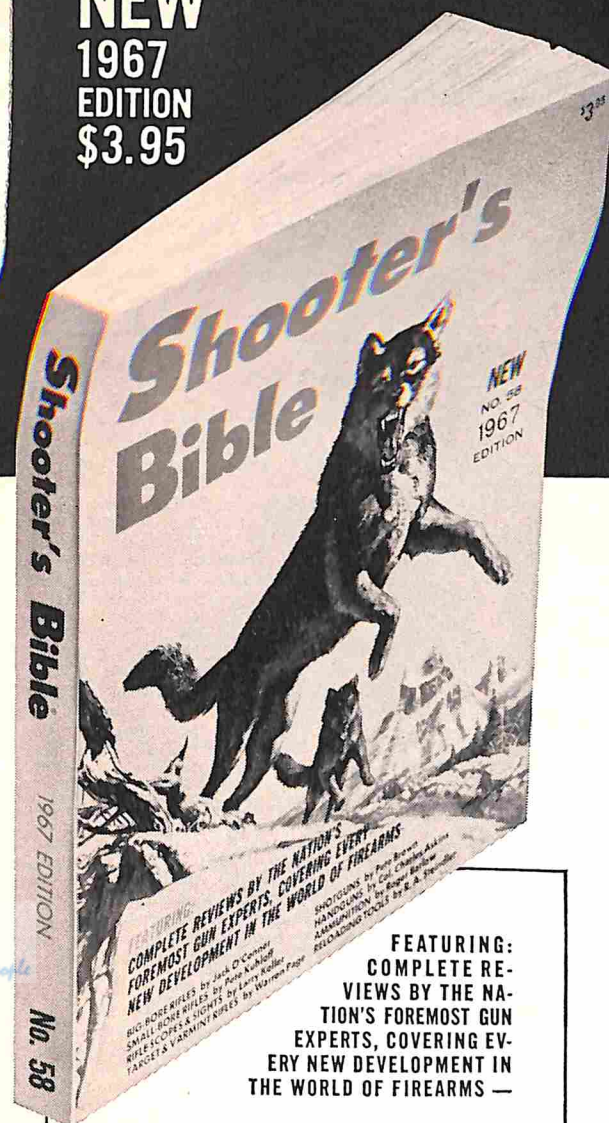
Hunters and shooters in general have reloaded their own ammunition for many decades.

Today handloaders assemble the components of a typical round—powder, primer, cartridge case and bullet—because reloading can save them money and because it can afford the opportunity to load cartridges to individual specifications.

The reloading bench on this month's cover features (l-r.) a set of RCBS reloading dies, Lyman powder scale and RCBS measure, Hornady cal. .30 bullets, and reloaded .30-06 cartridges.

The cover is from a 4"x5" color transparency by Ronald Lowery of Vienna, Va. Camera was a 4x5 Linhof. Mr. Lowery used Ektachrome Type B film exposed 1/2 second at F/32, with two 3200°K lamps and an electronic flash on the background.

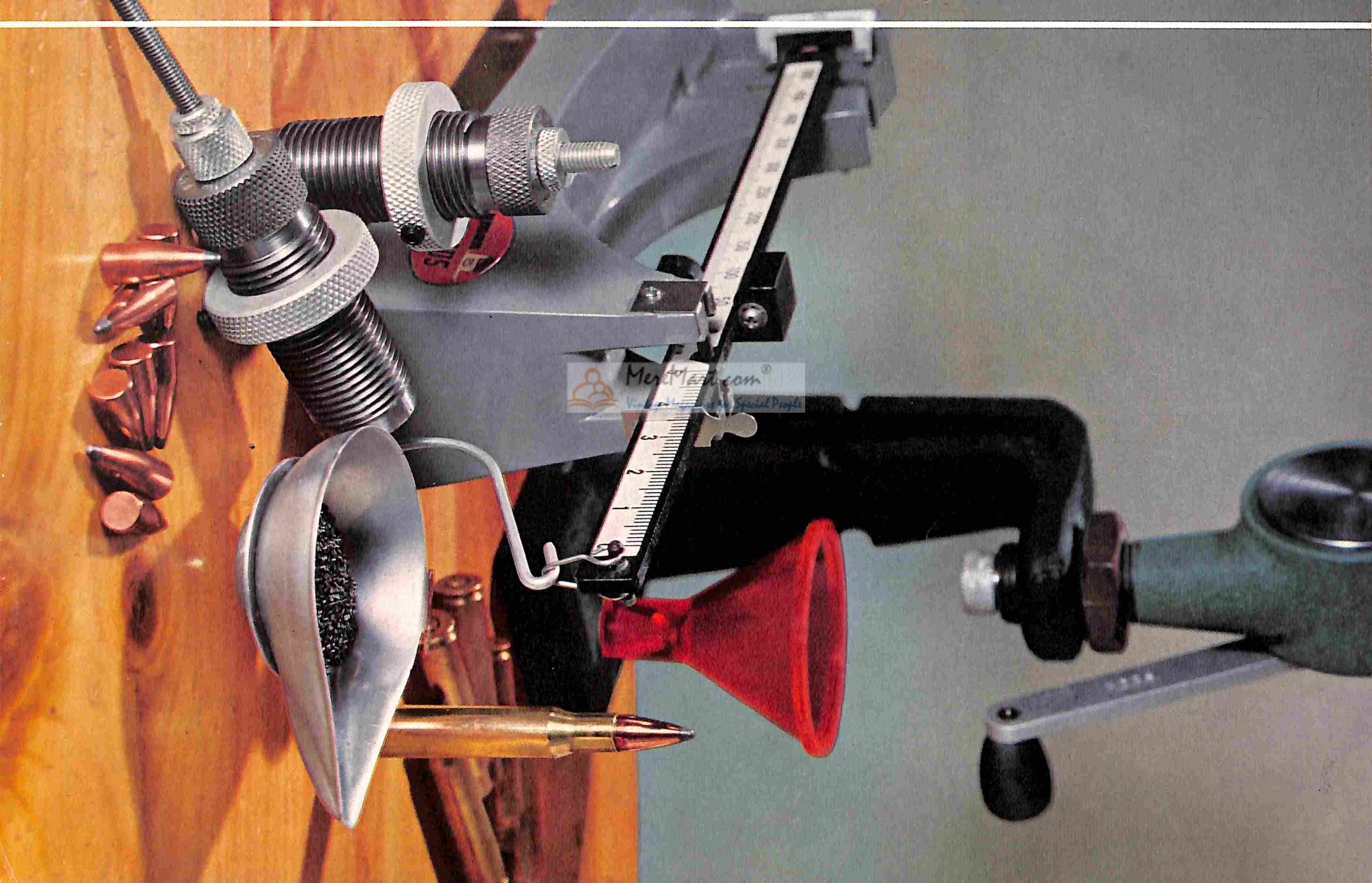
