What About Distance?



, Q. How far can I

with your naked 6x eye. A 16x50 brings objects 16 times Par closer. If you can recognize an object at a mile with the unaided eye, theo-

retically you should recognize the object 16 miles away. However, tremor of hand magnified so highly tends to distort vision. That's why lower-powered binocs are better for general use.

Sizes for Varmint Hunting

Q. What type of binocular do you recommend for varmint hunting? (Woodchucks, prairie dogs, crows,

A. A 10x50 would be your wisest choice. MereManus Magnification and light gathering are high enough to "spot-light" small varmints at 400 yards, even at dusk and dawn. However, if you want a binocular that you can use for big game as well as varmints, a good compromise would be an 8x40.

7x50 vs 7x35

Q. Can't decide whether to get a 7x50 or 7x35. What do you recommend?

A. Both the 7x35 and 7x50 will give identical performance from 1 hour before sunrise to ½ hour after sunset (also at night sport events), providing both are of same optical quality. When it is pitch dark, the 7x50 will give greater illumination. The 7x35 is America's favorite because of its lighter weight and greater compactness.

Holding Binoculars

Q. What is the best way to hold binoculars for maximum steadiness, minimum fatigue?

A. Hold barrels of binocs with fingers (NOT palms). This drops your hand into a position to easily place the thumbs against the lower part of the cheek bones. This gives a 4-point suspension that literally "locks" your binoculars in place. Folder we issue illustrates best methods of holding various binoculars with or without eye glasses.
