

Senator Estes Kefauver was an amateur carpenter and enjoyed puttering around the house. Senator Robert Kerr of Oklahoma was an enthusiastic fisherman and an outdoor cook who liked to barbecue a steak in his own backyard grill. Like a good many of his fellow Georgians, Sen-ator Richard Russell was an avid hunter, particu-larly of game birds. Illinois Governor Adlai Stevenson's best sport and first love was tennis although in his younger days he regularly rode to the hounds.





ROYAL CROWN COLA Best by taste-test


