# LIFE'S PICTURES

To take the 500-lb. bomb sequence in LIFE's skip-bombing essay (pp. 93-99) in Florida, Bernard Hoffman placed his magic-eye camera two and a half feet from the target. When he saw the bomb leave plane he pressed the automatic release on the camera—and ran. He was only 20 feet away when the bomb struck the ground. When dust cleared, Hoffman saw that bomb had hit target dead-centermissed camera by two and a half feet.


