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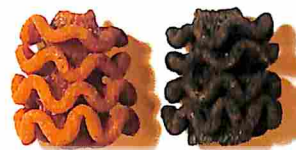

Stuffed pastas often need no sauce, only melted butter and herbs. For a more divine dish, try Cappelli di Prete - "Priest's Hats".



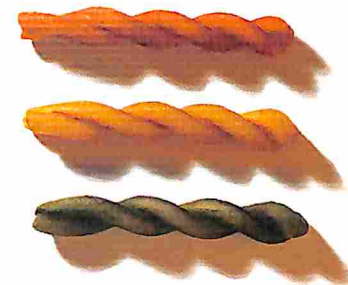
Radiatori "Little Radiators"

For cheese sauces. Colors add little flavor. Squid ink in black pasta, for instance, adds no taste. To the relief of many, we suspect.

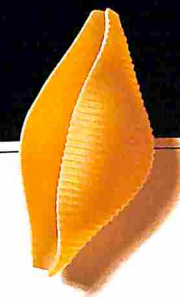


Orecchioni "Large Ears"  
Can be stuffed with wild boar, lobster, or - the most popular - leftovers.

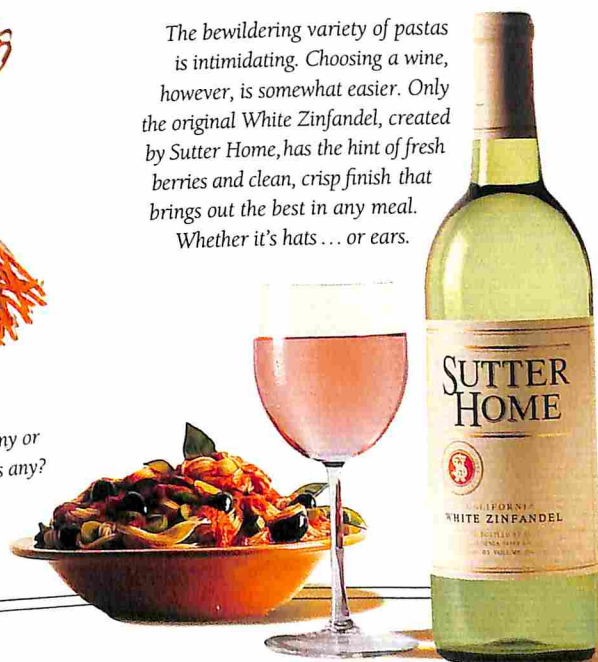


Occhi di Trota "Trout's Eyes"

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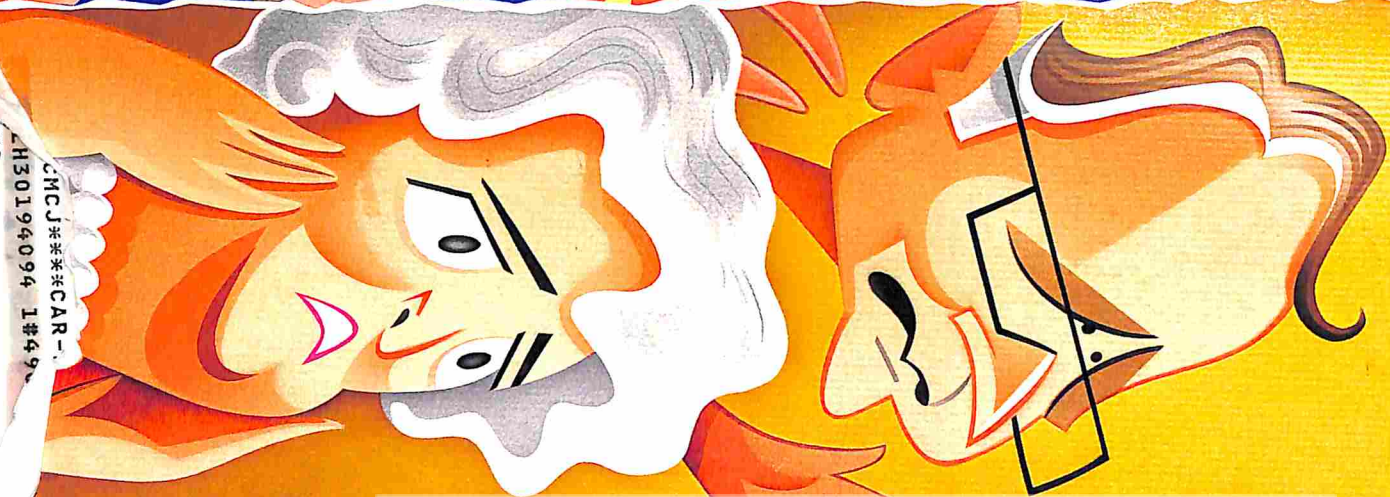


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
