The engraved and carved rifle The engraved and carved rifle shown on the cover is a Weatherby Mark V, in cal. 7 mm. Weatherby Magnum. The rifle telescope is a Weatherby Imperial 4x81. The rifle is a 'sheep gun' owned by Herb Klein of Dallas, Tex., a big-game hunter who has a double collection of all 4 species (Big horn, Desert, White [Dall], and Stone) of North American big horn sheep. 
