



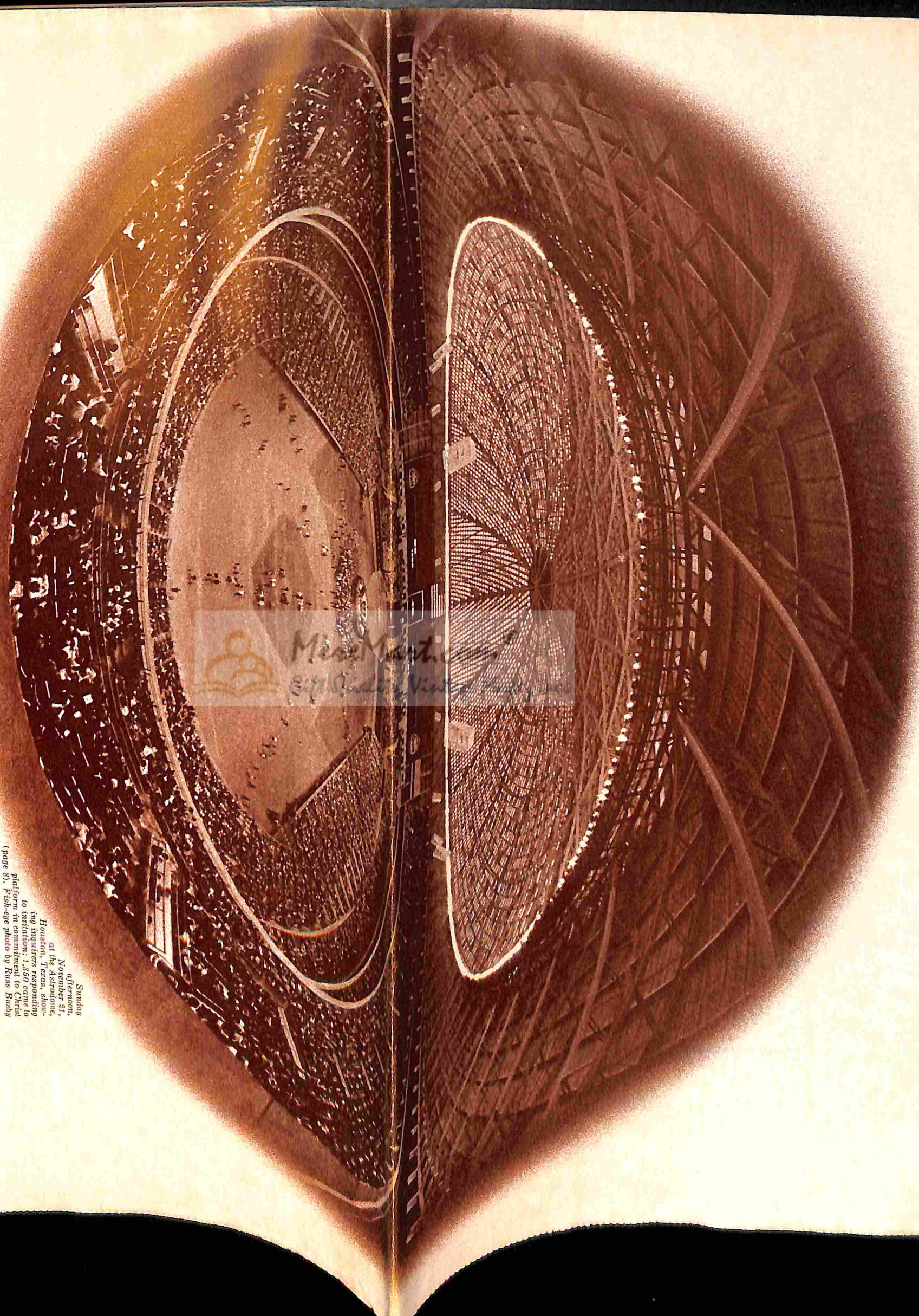

HOW TO RECEIVE CHRIST

Some time ago during a question-and-answer session at Harvard Divinity School, a student stood up and asked me, "Can you tell me in plain and clear language what I must do to be saved?" Over and over again, as I lecture at colleges and universities, I am asked that question. Can the alcoholic, the thief, the murderer, the sex pervert, be changed radically and made a new man? At a West Coast university a professor of science came to see me in my room at the Student Union, and he said: "You are going to be amazed at the ultimate question I am here to ask you." Then he told me a long story of his own inward struggle with moral, spiritual and intellectual issues. "More and more," he said, "I have come to realize that my problem with Christianity is really not intellectual at all. It is moral. I have not been willing to meet the moral requirements of Christianity." And he added: *continued on page 14*
