GOOD in GARDEN

Climax of their efforts will come this month as the Graham Team arrives to join with pastors and churches in a great ten-day Crusade in the new 20,000-seat Madison Square Garden over Penn Station. The dates are Friday, June 13, to Sunday, June 22.

Those who remember the great 16-week campaign of the summer of 1957 can be assured of one thing: this one will be different. Just to take one leaf from the thick book Crusade Director Bill Brown is carrying around these days: the youth emphasis will be exceedingly strong. A "coffee house" will be opened in the Manhattan Center at the corner of 34th Street and Eighth Avenue, and it is expected that a thousand teen-agers will be crowding the place each night following the service. Special "youth nights" are planned for Satur-

of the school; deans will be Dr. Kenneth Chaffin of the Graham Team and Professor Kenneth Seminary, of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. The number in attendance at some previous schools has been over one thousand, and New York participation is expected to be larger.

Over two hundred buses are expected nightly at the Garden, but they will bring only a small portion of the crowd. By jet airplane, by Long Island train, by Penn-Central charter special, by subway, by private car and on foot, people are expected to come. And millions who will not get there at all will be talking to God about the Garden and the people who will be committing their lives to Jesus Christ during the evangelistic services. This is the "cloud of witnesses" whose intercession made possible the Crusade in the first place.

Two trainloads will be coming to the Garden from Tennessee: one from Memphis, one from Nashville. (The latter, organized by Richard "Pek" Gunn, will be the fifteenth such Crusade Special from Nashville.) Other special trains will arrive from Philadelphia; Atlanta, Georgia; Columbia and Greenville, South Carolina; and Charlotte, North Carolina. Twenty persons are coming from Australia, and 65 by charter jet from Britain. * On June 14 some five thousand Salvation Army officers will attend with their commander, General Frederick Coutts.

Among the key personalities who will be active in the Crusade are Dr. Elmer Engstrom, chairman; W. Maxey Yarmann; George Chapman; Roger Hull; and the four vice chairmen, Dr. Bryant Kirklund, Dr. Stephen F. Olford, Dr. Richard A. Hildebrand, and Dr. Razziel I. Vazquez. Crusade office manager is Jack Cousins.

The Garden Crusade of 1969 is shaping up as one of the great Christian events of the latter 20th century. Pray that in addition to the incidental color, thrill and excitement, there will be thousands of lives permanently changed and redirected by Jesus Christ, to the glory of God.
