



**Asia-South Pacific
Congress on Evangelism**

thirds of the world's three billion people are to be found in the area embraced by the Asian Congress. Delegates will be coming to Singapore from Afghanistan in the west and Fiji in the east; from Japan in the north and New Zealand in the south. Over one thousand clerical and lay leaders are expected to attend, by invitation, from the 24 countries in the area.


Asian leaders believe the Singapore Congress will do in depth what the Berlin Congress did in breadth. Some major churches are participating through official representatives, and inter-church bodies are sending selected observers. The largest contingent, 115, will come from India. Indonesia will send 100; Japan and Australia will send 80 each.

A statement of purpose released by the executive committee reflects the tone of the Congress. It "asks the guidance of God" as the Congress "seeks through prayer, study of the Scriptures and mutual consultation to discover ways of implementing the proposals of the 1966 World Congress on Evangelism in our area, challenged by an exploding population and social upheaval;

"To expound the relevance of the Christian evangel and to stress the urgency of its proclamation" to two billion Asians;

"To study the obstacles to evangelism inherent in the diverse cultures of Asia to find specialized methods which will effectively overcome them; "To share in discussion the tools and techniques of evangelism" to cope with rapid urbanization, problems of youth and the home, poverty, and other social issues;

To summon the churches to "a bold cooperative program" of vitalized evangelism and missionary outreach.
