The Mini-14 is a scaled-down Ruger version of the famous U. S. Garand-type rifles. It embodies the proven engineering ideas and superior materials that are standard in all Ruger products. Introduced in 1972, after more than five vears of engineering and development, the Mini-14 has been widely accepted by Government and law-enforcement agencies all over the world. Now, with expanded production facilities operating smoothly, the Mini-14 can be offered for sale to individuals.

The sophistication of the Mini-14 mechanism lies in the fact that it is composed of rela-

tively few, extremely rugged components. Breech and firing mechanisms are held to a min-

imum in size and weight by the efficient use of hardened chrome-molybdenum steels.

Music wire coil springs are used throughout. The Mini-14 can be field stripped to its eight basic subassemblies in seconds without the use of

The .223 (5.56mm) cartridge was originally adopted by the U. S. Armed Forces. It is commercially produced and is available in the United States in a variety of bullet configurations. The catalog muzzle velocity is 3300 feet per second, with 1330 foot pounds of muzzle energy.



The gas system is a fixed piston, moving cylinder, self-cleansing design. Unburned powder particles are automatically vented from the system. The mechanism is shown in full recoil after firing.
