THE COVER

The purity of line in these aluminum bench-rest rifle actions by Ralph Stolle reflects the precision of their maker's goal: Rifles that deliver 10 rounds on target so tight that they make only a single hole. The larger action is a 1975 Stolle Polar; the smaller, a 1973 Panda which has oxidized to a different shade. Action screws are bushed for shipping and handling; only the escutcheons and trigger guards are inletted. Stolle actions are not usually glued into the wood. For more detail, see p. 27. 
