THE COVER

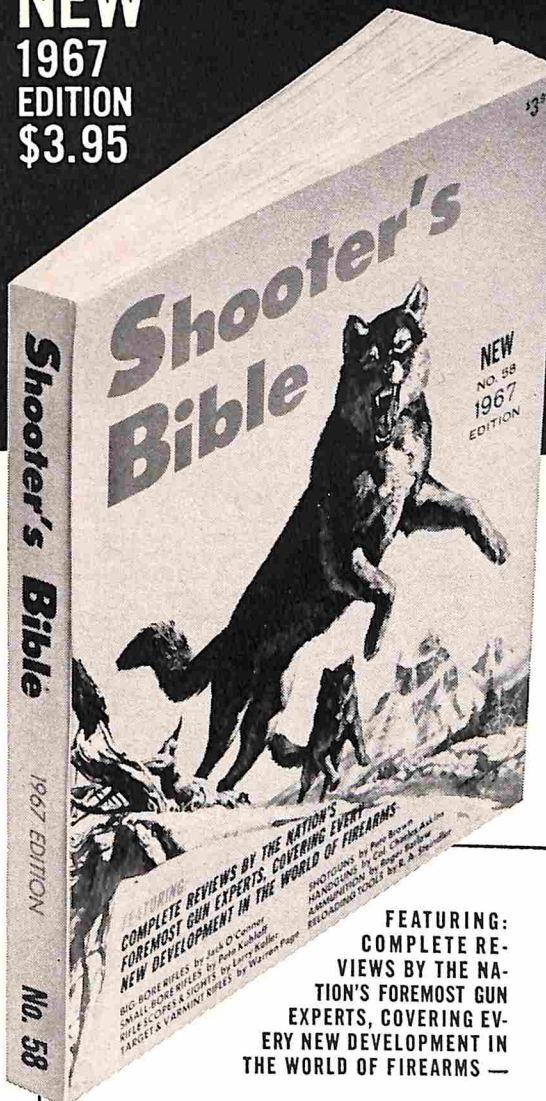
The Canada goose in V-formation is a familiar sight as he heralds the changing seasons. Nesting in the northern marshes of Alaska and Canada and several northern states, he wings south in the late fall and north in early spring, occasionally sounding his familiar honk-honk. A favorite target of U.S. waterfowlers, who last year bagged 425,000, the gray-brown Canada goose is distinctly marked with a prominent white patch on the underside of its head. He has a wing spread between 5 and 6½ ft. and weighs 7 to 14 lbs.

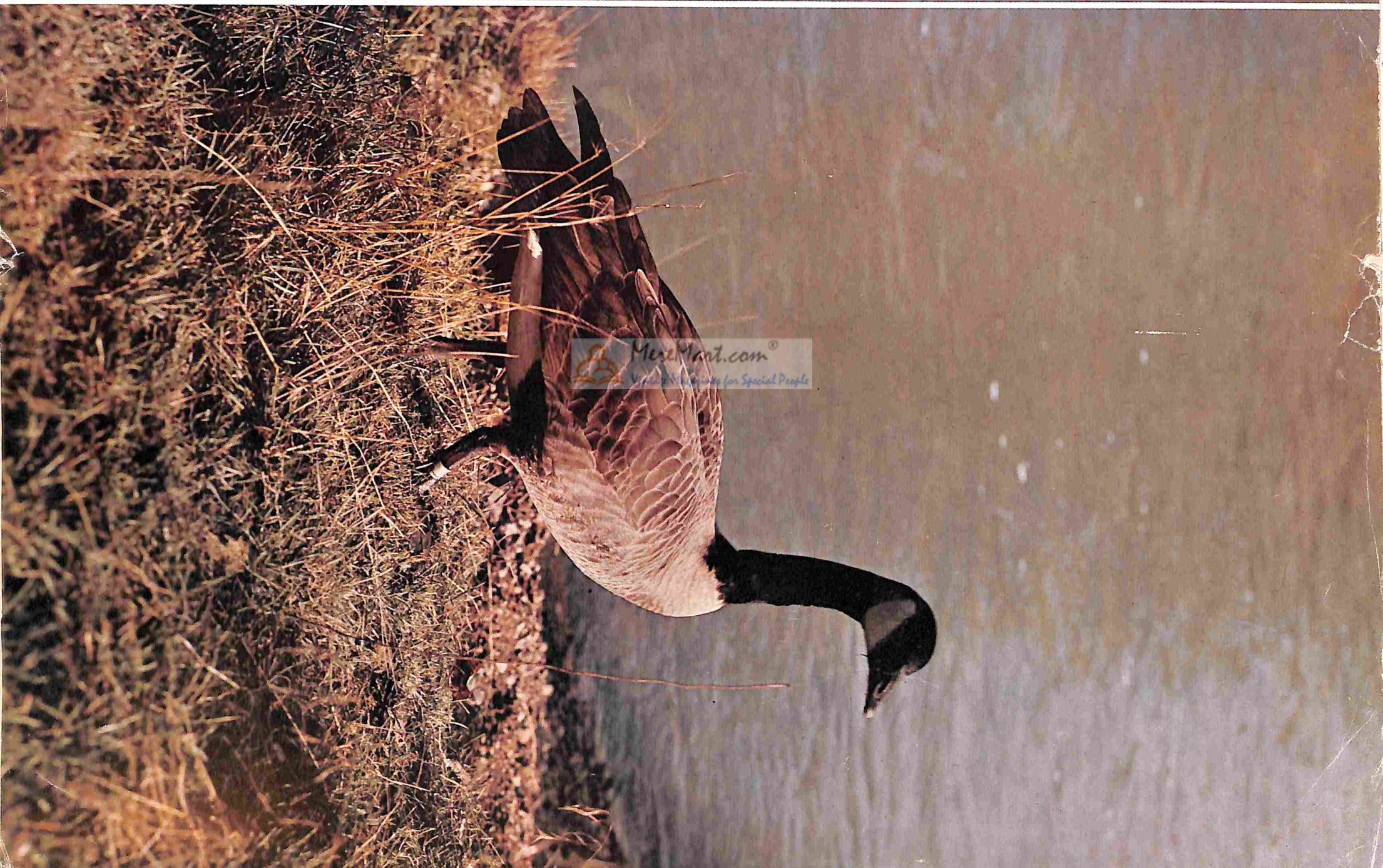
