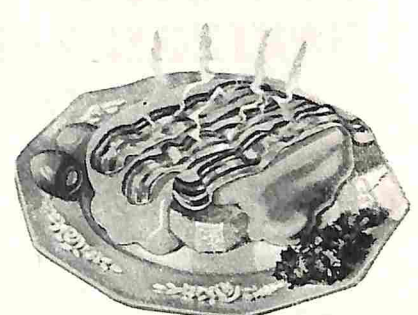

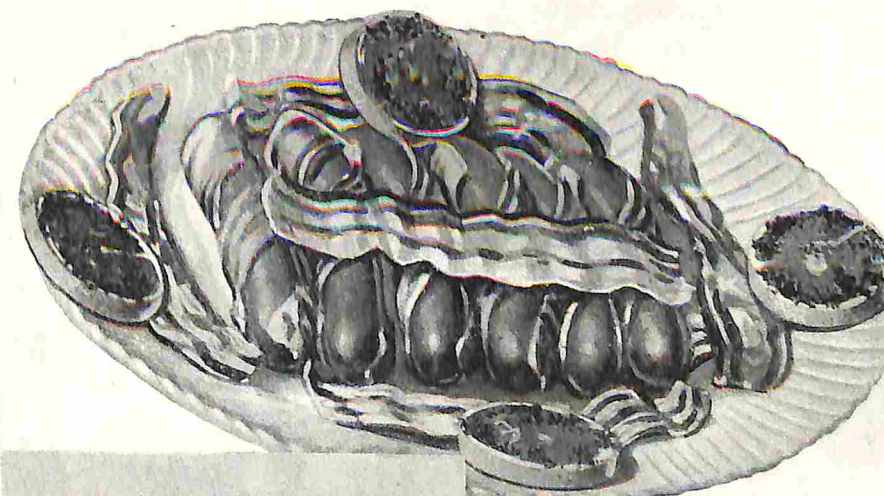

CHEESE TOAST WITH STAR BACON. See page 6 of recipe book with 36 Ways to Serve Star Bacon.



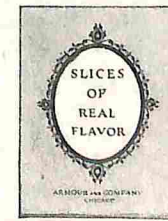
STUFFED STAR BACON SLICES. See page 13 of recipe book with 36 Ways to Serve Star Bacon.
