THE COVER: The Lincoln statue in the Lincoln Memorial, Washington, D.C., by Daniel Chester French, from a detail of a painting by Dean Cornwell (1892-1960). Six years were devoted to the creation and execution of the statue which is nineteen feet high from head to foot and is carved from twenty-eight blocks of Georgia white marble. It rests upon an oblong pedestal of Tennessee marble 10 feet high, 16 feet wide, and 17 feet deep. The Lincoln Memorial was dedicated May 30, 1922.
