LIFE'S PICTURES

Edward Clark and his cameras were on hand at one of the most significant historical events in modern times, the trial of the Nazi leaders at Nürnberg (see pp. 27-31). The first day, in drawing lots for the days' positions in the courtroom, he was unusually lucky. Thus the second day he was able to get the faces of 19 of the defendants as they pleaded not guilty (pp. 30-31). He missed one, Rudolf Hess, who popped up and down with his "Nein!" before anybody could catch him.

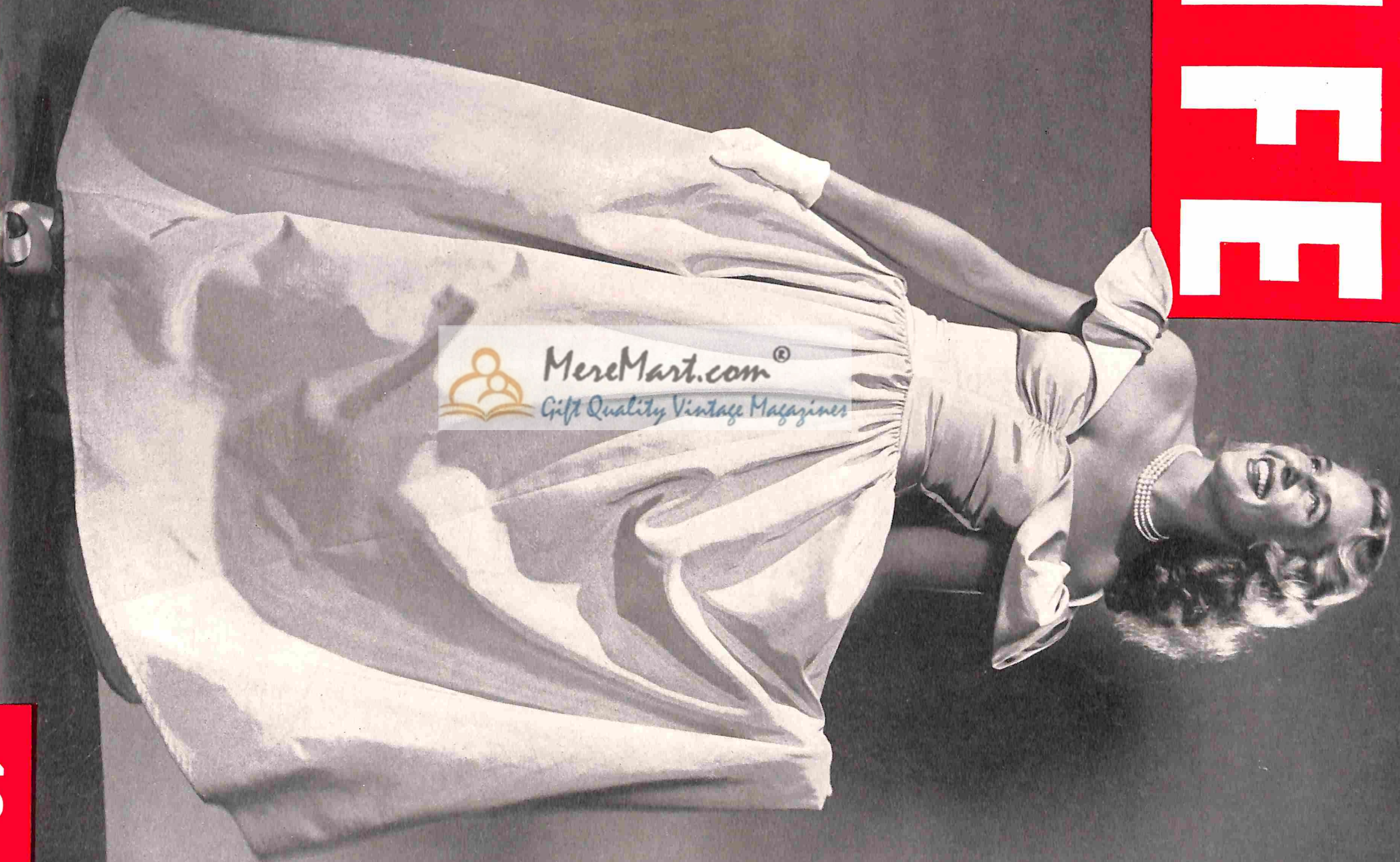
