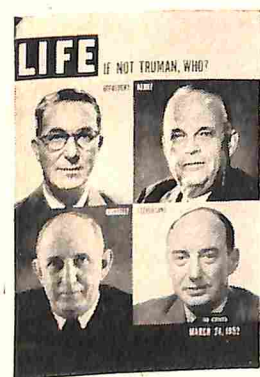

The four men on LIFE's cover this week now devote most of their waking hours to politics. But there was a time when each one had some leisure for an avocation. Senator Estes Kefauver was an amateur carpenter and enjoyed putting around the house. Senator Robert Kerr of Oklahoma was an enthusiastic fisherman and an outdoor cook who liked to barbecue a steak in his own backyard grill. Like a good many of his fellow Georgians, Senator Richard Russell was an avid hunter, particularly of game birds. Illinois Governor Adlai Stevenson's best sport and first love was tennis although in his younger days he regularly rode to the hounds.

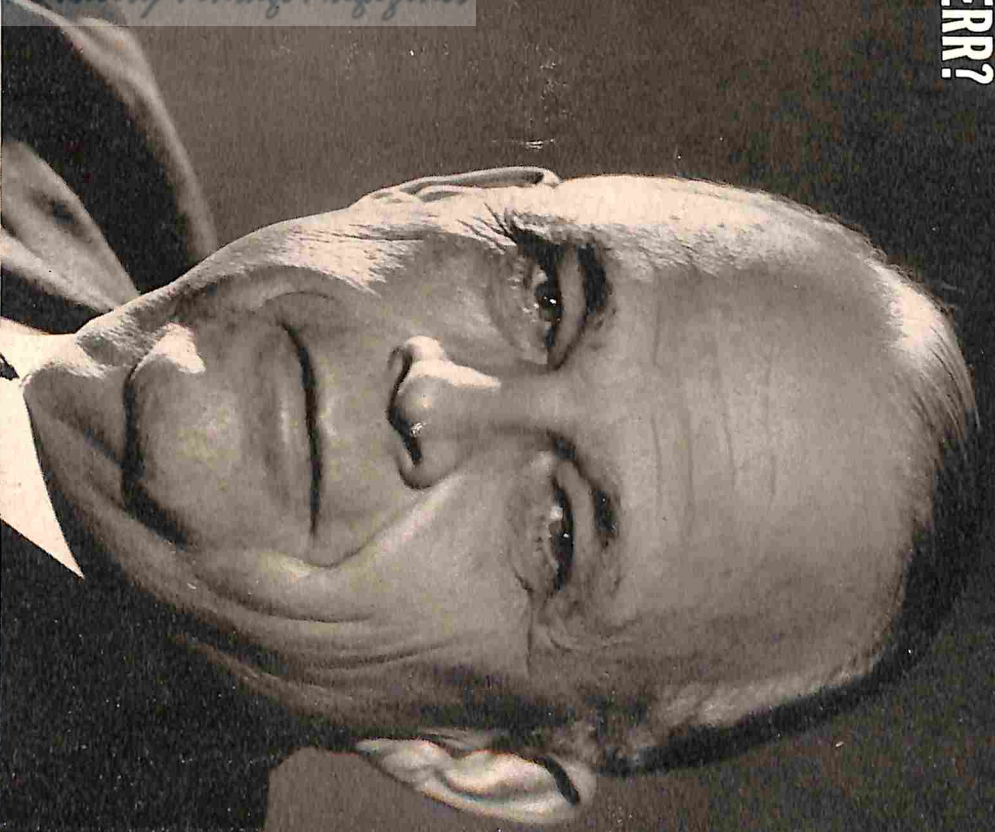
