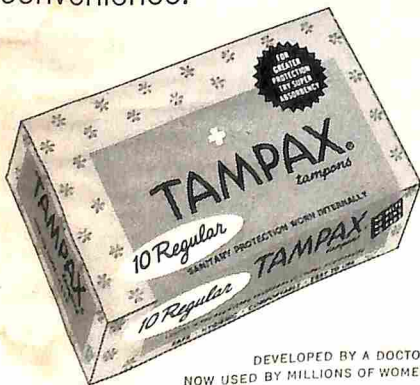


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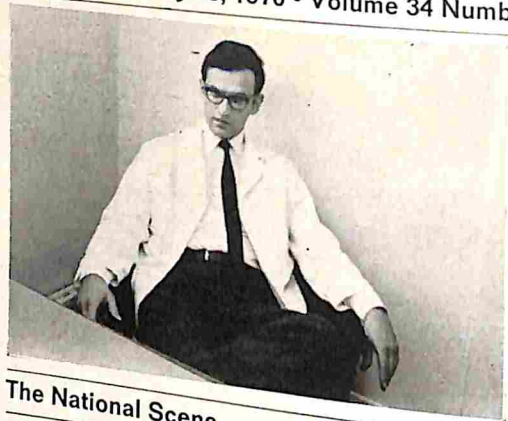


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"I know that you deplore this conflict as much and as intensely as I," Dr. Murray Helfant writes in his letter, which was delivered to President Nixon before its publication in LOOK. Helfant saw the war's toll in ruined young bodies at his neurosurgery ward in Japan.
