It certainly was a pleasure to see you at the spring shoot, and I look forward to seeing you again this coming Labor Day at Friendship.

What I have to write about I sincerely hope will not be construed as aimless criticism of the folks that set up the matches, and do all the hard work to make them a success. If you wish—you may print this in your column in Muzzle Blasts, but whether you do or don't, I though I would sound off just to let you know my ideas on the subject. I wouldn't write this if I wasn't sure that there are several other shooters that share the same feelings.

First of all I am one of that growing fraternity of guys that like to smell his black powder while standing on his two "hind legs". I drove some 350 miles along with two other fellows from here to the matches. All three of us like to shoot offhand, and have only offhand rifles. When I registered and got my program of matches, and ran my finger down this list of contests that I could enter, I found only three, namely; the 50 yard offhand, the Geo. Rodgers Clark Memorial, and the daily 25 yard offhand re-entry. It was useless to enter in the Founder's because it is a combination rest—offhand. To me this was somewhat disappointing, and I know that there were several others that drove much greater distances that shared my disappointment.

If you were on the firing line at the time the first relay opened you would have noticed that practically every target rack on the 25 yard range was occupied, while less than half of the 50 yard range was being used.

Since I have been in the Association only a couple of years, I am not familiar with the procedure of getting a little more recognition for the offhand boys in the way of more matches to shoot. Let us know of you views and suggestions.

I would have liked to have entered in a 50 yard offhand with a 100 yard target, a 50 yard re-entry, and a couple more 25 yard offhand matches. I can't hit anything, but it sure is fun.

I know that it is easy to sit on the sidelines and "cry-the-blues" and criticize, but I've said it and I hope that I haven't lost any friends.

Surely one of the objects of holding a shoot, other than finding out who is the best shot, and from a business point of view, is to make some money for the NMLRA Range Improvement. A few more offhand matches certainly would have put more greenbacks in the treasury.

Thanks for your past favors and your patience in reading all this. Keep your powder dry, Suh.


