

A GUNMAN JOURNEYS ON

In Memoriam

"Shiff the Gunman" is dead. Carl B. Shiffer, the last of the plainsmen, born in a covered wagon somewhere near the border of Montana and South Dakota in 1855, might almost be said to have died with his boots on and with a Peacemaker Colt .45 in his pocket. He was found fatally injured, all alone in the spined cabin and workshop at North was round ratary injured, all alone in his combined cabin and workshop at North Woodstock, N. H. on August 23rd, unconscious, his skull fractured and he passed away a few hours after he was removed to Littleton Hospital, then to Mary Hitch-cock Hospital in Hanover, N. H., in a last effort to prolong the life of a rugged individualist, a genius, a famous man in

the world in which he chose to live and work; that of a rare gun collector and

Shiff the Gunman, as he preferred to call himself and as he was best known to the thousands from coast to coast, fell to the floor of his gunroom, apparently in the seizure of a shock, and might have died there, alone, behind locked doors, but for the chance visit of an express delivery man who knocked and got no response on that Saturday when Death had knocked at his lonely home.

He had lived a full life, a life extending over almost a century and by his own declaration made to the writer earlier this

year, he had never been ill in his life until February when Death first rapped with bony fingers at his snowbound cabin —and had gone away. That, too, was on a Saturday at 2 A. M., when he awoke seeming to be suffocating.

With the will to live remarkable in a man of his age, Shiff fought off a very serious illness which seems to have been a combination of asthma and heart trouble and which left his heart "very weak and irregular" in the midst of a storm that lasted for days.

That time it was the mailman who discovered Shiff's plight and brought a doc-(Continued on page 3)
