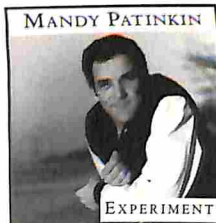


MANDY PATINKIN

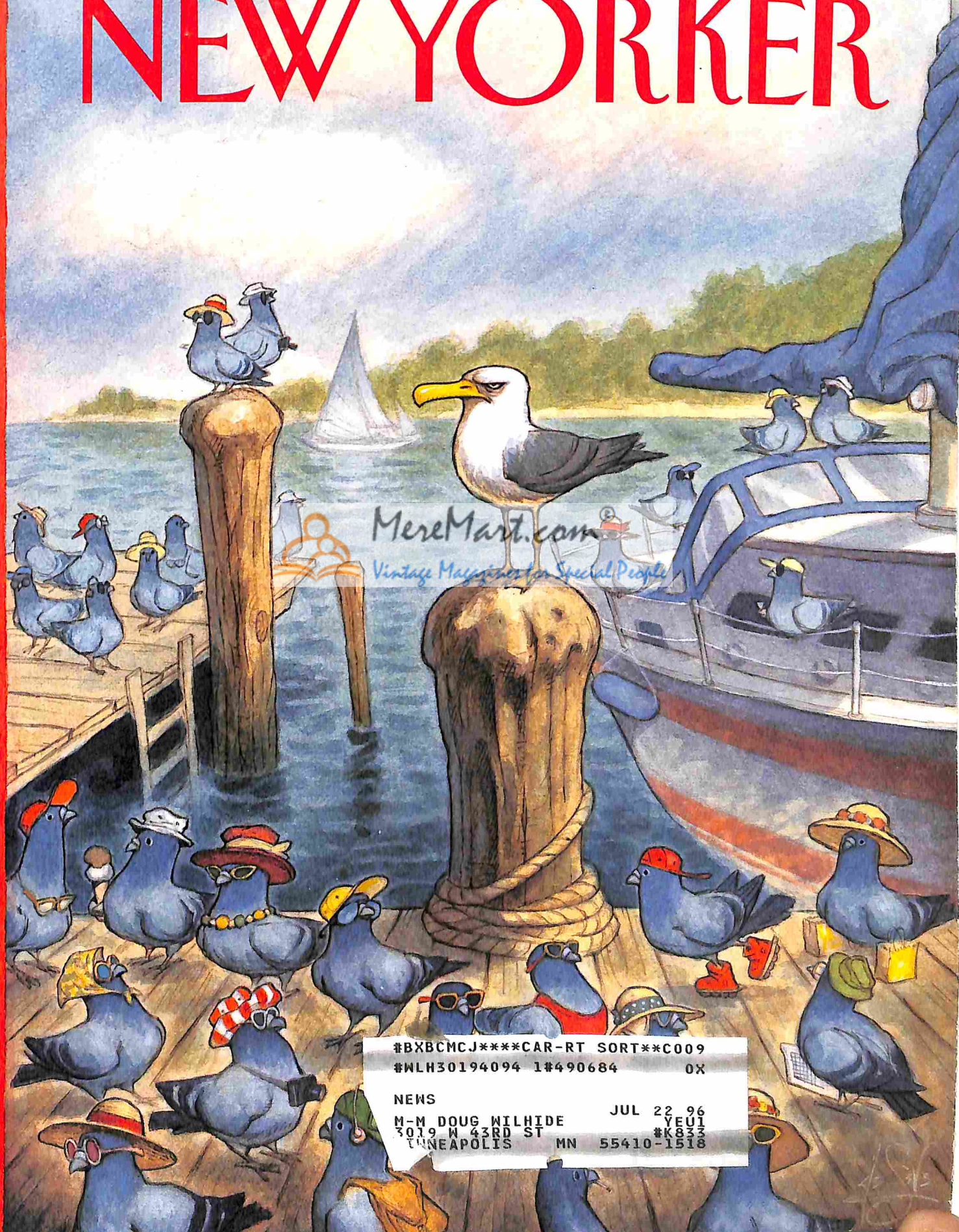
