in April, May and June. At the midpoint of this awards season, TIME has already captured a wallful of major honors. Last week the prestigious Overseas Press Club of America added three more. Correspondents Walter Isaacson and Donald Neff were given the O.P.C.'s Mary Hemingway Award for best magazine reporting from abroad, for their work on last year's cover story "The Colombian Connection: Billions in Pot and Coke." Neff interviewed drug enforcement officials in New York, Miami and Bogotá, and surveyed by small plane the clandestine airstrips and marijuana plantations of Colombia's remote Guajira province. "We got shot at when we flew too low," says

Neff. "They probably thought we were hijackers after their crop." Isaacson, who wrote the story hausted as after their Isaacson, who wrote the story, haunted seedy cafés in New York City's Jackson Heights to talk with distributors at the other end of the "Colombian connection."
