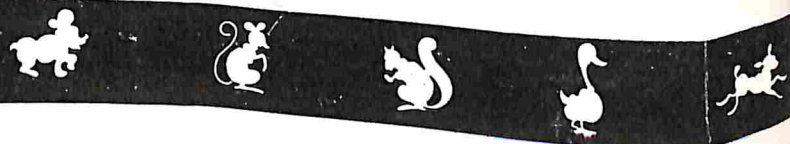
October Days

We have tried in every possible way to continue publishing WEE WISDOM at the same price as before the war, but we now find it is impossible to do it any longer, so we are raising the price to two dollars a year, starting October 15. We are not complaining about the costs because we know that the men who cut the trees that go to make the paper, the men who work in the mills, the ink makers, the printers, the artists and writers, all these people, are having to pay more for rent and food and clothing for themselves and their children. Your father may be one of these men, and of course we want you to have all that is good. By raising our price to two dollars a year we can meet these higher costs and continue to give you WEE WISDOM. We feel sure you will understand why it is necessary to increase the price of WEE WISDOM.
