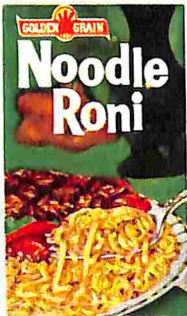

EXPLICATING "THE PILL" will take Dr. Robert W. Kistner (see "The Pill: Facts and Fallacies," page 51) around the world this fall to share his knowledge of the latest research on fertility and its controls with students and faculties at foreign medical schools. At home, he is senior gynecologist and obstetrician at Boston Hospital for Women, an assistant professor in these specialties at Harvard Medical School and consultant to the U. S. Air Force Surgeon General in gynecology and obstetrics. Dr. Kistner has been married for twenty-five years and he and his wife have three sons and a daughter. Busy as he is, he expects to find time during the summer for a few trips to Cape Cod with his family for some salt air, tennis and swimming.

BEHIND THE BEARD and walrus mustache worn by Edward Gorey, illustrator of this month's "Collector's Cook Book," is a man of many parts: a balletomane, a gourmet chef, an author who has illustrated twenty-three of his own books (*The Other Statue*, *The Utter Zoo*), an artist who has provided drawings for a couple of dozen books by other people (Muriel Sparks' *The Very Fine Clock*, Peter F. Neumeyer's *Donald and the . . .*). Although he specializes in the macabre, his "dough boys" on pages 67-73 are all sweetness and light. Mr. Gorey lives in New York only when the New York City Ballet Company does—he never misses a performance—and spends the remaining seven-or-so months in a 1785 house on Cape Cod, where, he says, he is more likely to be found bending over a cooking pot than over his drawing board.

HAY AND HENS aren't exactly run-of-the-mill fashion props (see "Rusticclothes ★ American Style," pages 40-41), but Frances McLaughlin Gill, one of New York's top photographers, didn't bat an eye when the twenty bales and barnyard fowl were trundled into her studio. In the past, Mrs. Gill has welcomed sheep, St. Bernards, even a broad-winged hawk, into her domain, and she respects the professionalism of her animal models—"They seem to know where the camera is and don't wander out of range." An exception to this occurred with one of our hens, however: it spotted a prop basket full of eggs and, bristling with mother instinct, headed straight for it.
