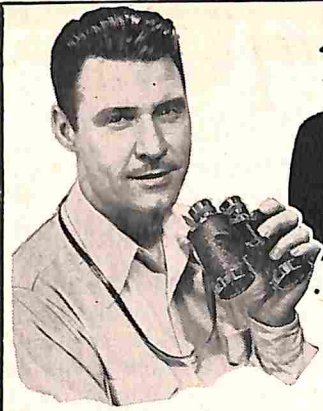

**A.** Wild Fowl, Deer: 7 x 35. Big Game, Prairie Game, Coyotes: 9 x 35 or 10 x 50. Mountain Goats: 8 x 30 or 6 x 20.

**Eyestrain-Headaches**

**Q** Seems I get headaches and dizzy spells after concentrating for any period thru my binoculars. Could something be wrong with the instrument?  
**A.** Definitely. The two binocular barrels are either not parallel—pointing to same image and/or a prism may be cocked, causing one image to tilt. This causes muscle strain, as the eyes try to compensate and fuse the two images. Precise alignment of both optical and mechanical axis is essential. Can be attained only by skilled technicians with special equipment. Our laboratory may be able to help you.
