Incidentally.

As we announced last month (page 27), the high cost of living has finally caught up with us. That grim appointment with Old Man Economics . . . the date we have postponed for so long . . . has upset the apple cart at last. Up go Association membership rates from three bucks a year to four.

There isn't much point in further hashing over the whys and wherefores of the increase. The price of ground roundsteak (if you can afford it) tells a plainer story of rising prices than anything we can say! But fortunately,

there is a brighter side to the NRA's rate increase . . . and one not dictated entirely by that problem of increasing production costs. Luck being with us, the extra dollar coming in with every one-year membership will mean that we can not only keep pace with those rising costs and thus avoid curtailing activities . . . but also that we'll be able to do a good many things that were impossible in the recent past.

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Biggest advantage of operating without the deficit that has tagged us lately will be the opportunity of planning ahead to a much more effective degree. (You can't do much planning when the budget shows red ink on every other line.) Take the national rifle and pistol championships, for instance. Last year Congress dilly-dallied until the last minute,



and finally appropriated a sum that would not have financed a cow-pasture event had the Marine Corps not come to the rescue and furnished personnel for small bore and pistol matches at Camp Perry. This year the

story was the same ... except that Marine Corps commitments had increased, and they could spare neither the men nor the money to lend that helping hand. So . . . the 1948 national rifle and pistol championships, as far as Camp Perry is concerned, are out of the picture. There will be nationals . . . decided between regional champions, who

will fire shoulder-to-shoulder as a feature of the First Annual Convention of the NRA It is a good system . . . one that we have long thought about . . but the whole thing should have been decided months before and would have been if that deficit in Assor ciation books had not been so evident.

Here's where that extra dollar comes in should need to be a should It should now be feasible to plan and budget at the topics. at the beginning of each year for champion ship events, to be held at a definite time and place recognition. place regardless of Congressional whims.

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
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
