Dr. Emory M. Thomas, associate professor of history at the University of Georgia, is the author of this issue. He has to his credit three published works: *The Confederacy as a Revolutionary Experience* (1971), *The Confederate State of Richmond: A Biography of the Capital* (1971), and *The American War and Peace: 1860-1877* (1973). He is also the author of a forthcoming volume on the Confederacy for the New American Nation series.

Among the sources consulted by Dr. Thomas for this issue, he particularly recommends Rembert Patrick's *The Fall of Richmond* (1960), Virginius Dabney's *Richmond: The History of a City* (1976), and his own *The Confederate State of Richmond* (1971). For contemporary accounts of life in Richmond, Dr. Thomas suggests Ben Ames Williams' edition of Mary Boykin Chesnut's *Diary From Dixie* (1949) and Bell I. Wiley's edition of Phoebe Yates Pember's A Southern Woman's Story: Life in Confederate Richmond. Including Unpublished Letters Written From the Chimborazo Hospital (1959).
