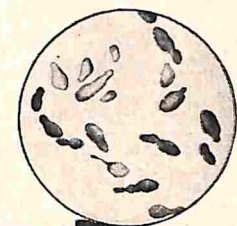
Photographing the girls on the Lake Shore
