James Madison was the fourth President of the United States. Although he was widely respected as a scholar of history, theology, and Hebrew, his political career was far from calm, for he was a radical and was not well liked. Madison championed, ahead of his time, much that we now take for granted—the then-unpopular causes of freedom of religion, separation of church and state, and the abolition of slavery. His legacy shines brilliantly: Madison gifted our nation by authoring nine of the first ten amendments to the Constitution, collectively known as The Bill of Rights. And of that Constitution, he is recognized as its father.

For his great contributions to our country, Madison has among his namesakes a village in eastern Illinois; a city in Indiana; a city in South Dakota; the capital city of Wisconsin; a borough in Morris County, New Jersey; a high school in Brooklyn; and a prominent avenue in Manhattan.
