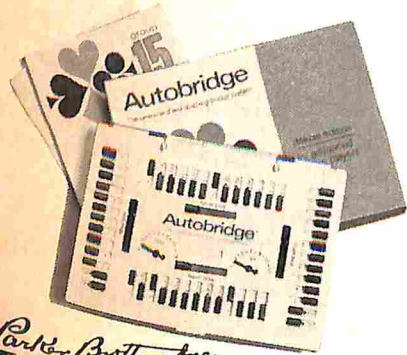

BRIDGE MAGIC. Many bridge players rely on magic for their success. They try to sit in the lucky seats or to deal with the lucky deck. If things don't go well, they try sitting on a handkerchief. But in the long run you have the same kind of cards no matter where you plant your seat. You can do better with those cards by working with your head. If you get a poor result with a hand, look for your mistakes in bidding or play. When your partner has made the mistake, try to recall whether you led him astray or whether you could have saved him. You will find it easier to work with your head if you practice with AUTOBRIDGE hands. Playing one or two hands a day will work like magic to improve your game; magic that will follow you to any seat at the bridge table.

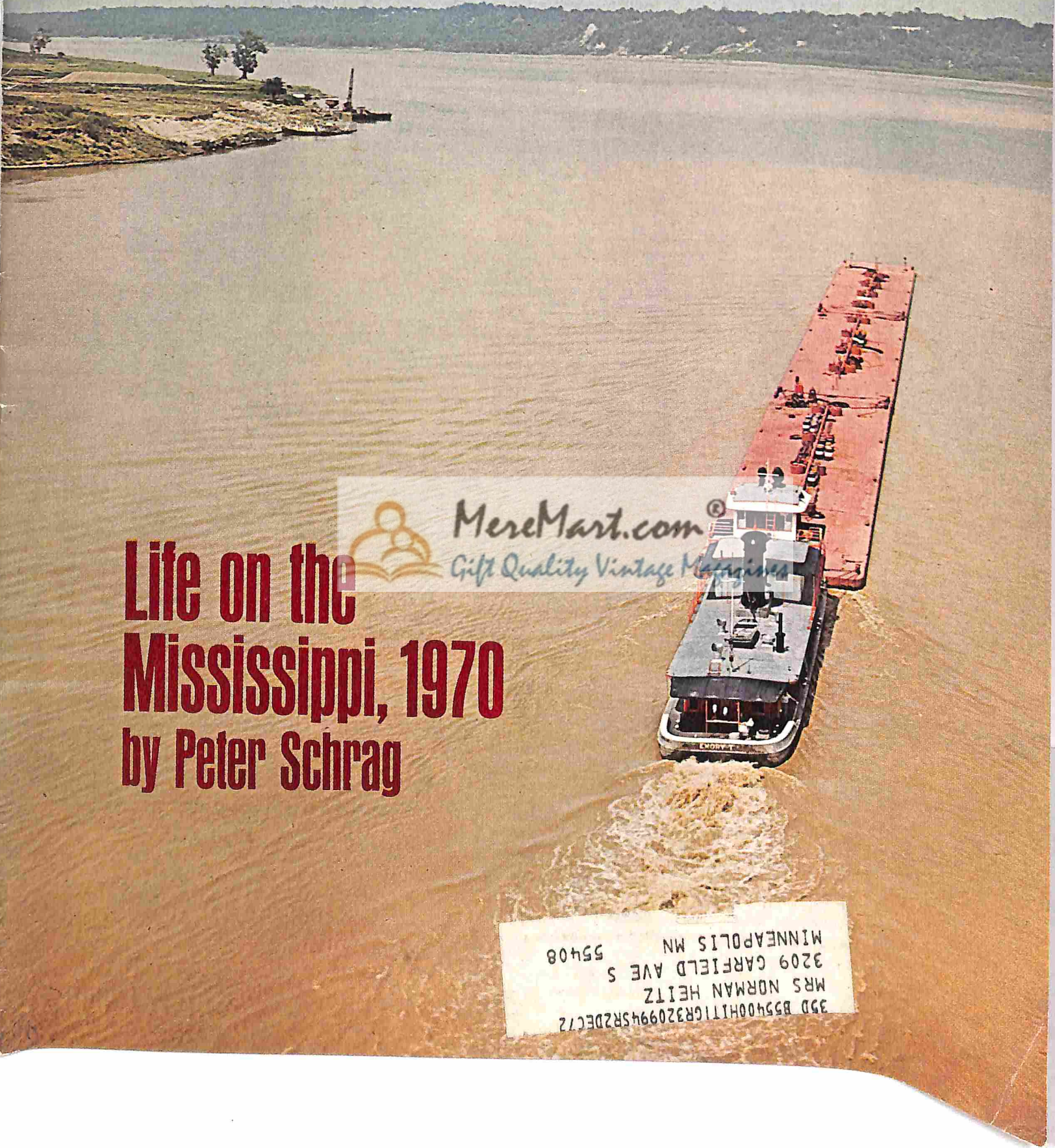
