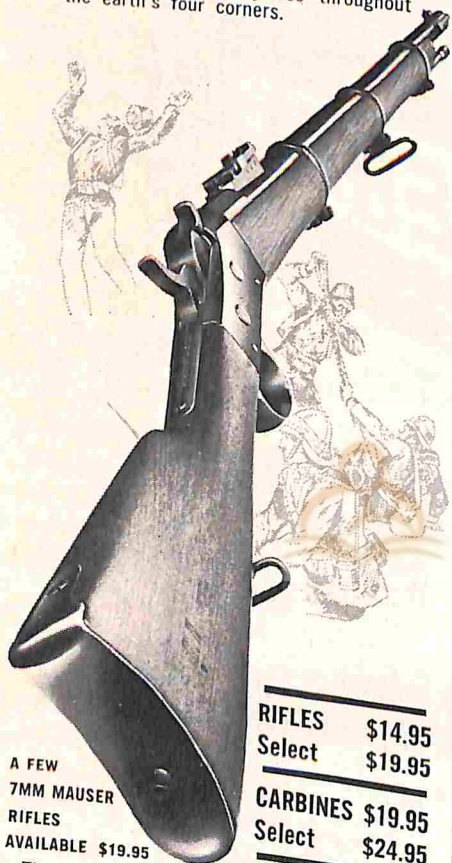


# ROLLING BLOCKS

... defeated Crazy Horse and Red Cloud — silencing the warwhoop of the redman forever. After winning fame in the American West, in 1867 during the Imperial Exposition in Paris, it was awarded the Silver Medal as the finest military or sporting arm in the world. By 1870 six foreign governments, including Egypt, adopted it as their standard arm. In 1880 it drew blood again while the mother Nile wept red for her fallen sons as the Egyptian Military Rebellion was quelled.
