If you use tax software, it will tell you if you can use it to pay by credit card.

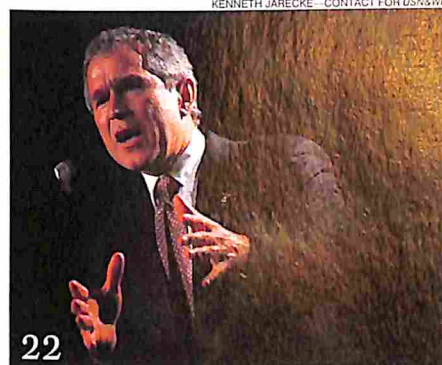
