POET Paul Engle has written in almost every literary medium, but nine books of poetry lead the list of his works, and poems preoccupied him even as a high school boy. He notes whimsically that a newly planted tree, under which his class poem was buried, did not survive. Clearly, though, the tree's demise was not symbolic: Five years later, in 1932, his master's thesis—a book of poems—won the Yale Series of Younger Poets prize.

CREATURE in this issue is the Grinch, who first reared his head nine years ago, glared at the holiday preparations in *Who-ville* and decided to steal Christmas. This makes him practically the only villain in a season that abounds with sweetness-and-light characters like reindeer Rudolph, and he is justly famous for it.

His creator, Theodor Seuss Geisel, ("Dr. Seuss,") has written and illustrated over two dozen books for children, best sellers all. In working on this one, Mr. Geisel says he had moments—don't we all?—when he "was kind of rooting for the Grinch."

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
